

## Resources for adult literacies at the SETT 06 Exhibition in Glasgow, 20–21 September 2006

Alex McLeod of the Portree Learning Centre has found that they are able to motivate their learners by tailoring text quizzes and Java games to their specific needs, goals and interests.

Our flagship range of learning resources for adult literacies is the *Target Skills* suite. With titles covering literacy, numeracy and ESOL, the suite has been mapped to the Scottish Numeracy and Communication Core Skills and contains great learning from Access 1 through to Intermediate 2.

We can now also provide a complete flagship range of ESOL resources – *English in Action*. This offers learning for everyone, from beginners through to those who already have an intermediate level of ability, set in realistic scenarios that will be familiar, useful and recognisable to ESOL learners in the UK; examples include finding a flat, taking a bus, sending money home, choosing the right job and communicating at work. Each resource contains video and audio, interactive exercises and development work, tutor notes and additional printable exercises that students can complete away from the computer.

*Target Skills* and *English in Action* are both available through *SUFI* in Scottish **learn**direct centres.

We are also working on two key projects for the National Grid for Learning with Learning and Teaching Scotland, in partnership with the University of Strathclyde, creating online study skills resources for young people and educational professionals, and online information literacy courses. After successful, and extensive, trialling, the material is shortly to go live on the LT Scotland web site.

In partnership with our sister company, Network Publishing, this autumn we are also launching *Well at College*, a high-quality, flexible central learning resource designed to help colleges deliver cost-effective learner entitlement and additionality programmes. It is aimed at 14- to 19-year-old full-time learners and work-based apprentices, and is delivered through an e-learning platform, providing colleges with tutorial and enrichment modules together with lesson plans and resources for tutors.
